The Mariannhill Masithuthukisane project is an organic farming project run by the Diocese of Mariannhill in South Africa. The major goal of the project in South Africa is to train and hire local unemployed women and men to work in the cooperative, to feed a population of 3,500 people, many of whom are undernourished. The good news is that eventually, with training and knowledge, diocesan land will be offered to local people.
