The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops' Joint *Ad Hoc* Committee on Palliative Care has announced that **Horizons of Hope: A Toolkit for Catholic Parishes on Palliative Care** will be launched on November 15-16, 2021.

This Toolkit, available in both English and French, will allow Catholic communities to facilitate meaningful conversations on palliative care. Key features include a detailed facilitator's guide, four modules organized in a step-by-step learning process, videos, and take-home resources. This partnership ensured the development of a high-level resource that will benefit Catholics who are eager to grow in their understanding of palliative care and Church teaching on end-of-life questions.
